Quantitative Survey

Over 800 paper surveys were delivered to each home within the Parish

Parking

The **parking at the top of Tregea Hill** on double yellow lines extremely dangerous, causes drivers to pass parked cars on a blind bend

Parking around the school isn't great. Great if school could renew travel plan and encourage parents to find alternatives to parking on the double yellows

Parking on main road, cars at diagonal park too far out into the road

Parking/Traffic particularly surrounding school times is horrendous.
