" I love the Youth Group, I also like skating and skate all over the village. It would be good to have a skate park"

"Cars can be a nuisance in the Summer, parking is terrible. We get blocked in"

"This place (The Hub) would be a good place for young people in the evenings"

" There are things to do here but if your not in the surf club, there is not so much to do"

"I have seen lots of houses being built and they are very big houses for a small place"

"Why cant we have a skatepark and more to do"

### **Summary of the Event**

On the night the young people met together at the Hub, ate Pizza and drank Hot Chocolate whilst looking at the findings from the competition (Power Point prepared by Imogen Day). The event afforded the NDP committee members an opportunity to share the findings- views and opinions- gained from the Selfie Competition and also to share the earlier work undertaken in the Parish. This included work at the primary school the survey and World Café Event with supporting materials available on the night for the young people to view and ask questions about.

Claire Whelan (NDP Member) prepared a short survey for the young people to complete. Findings attached. Five young people signed up to help at future NDP events

Prior to The Hub event a number of NDP explanatory visits and consultations took place: Pool School- NDP Chair, Heather Mullin facilitated Year 7 Assembly with 60 young people attending. Portreath Youth Group- Terry Reynard and Cath Dennis visited twice with a total of 9 young people consulted. Portreath Surf Club – Terry and Cath met and consulted with 10 young people at the Club, listening to them and encouraging their participation.

Word of mouth combined with leaflet handouts helped to promote the event and interest in the NDP.

The overall aims of the competition and Hub event were twofold:

1. To explain the concept and purpose of the NDP to a wide range of young people, both from within the Parish and those who think of the village and its amenities as local to them.
2. To gather the Young peoples' vice and input into the NDP process





The above two young people spoke well on a video of their love of the Parish but also, their grave concerns that the heart and soul of the Parish will be eroded if Holiday and Second Homes continue to gather pace. They had good knowledge of what is happening in St Ives and spoke of it becoming a barren community in winter time.
